Question 4:

The IFB outlines a one (1)-year term with a budget of \$111,000. Does OCTA anticipate renewals or contract extensions based on vendor performance?

The IFB states that the software must be delivered electronically. Does OCTA prefer a vendor-hosted cloud solution (SaaS) or a self-hosted deployment on OCTA's infrastructure?
